From the Pastor's Desk

In Isaiah 58, God calls for the prophet to address false religious practices. The people were observing spiritual disciplines for selfish reasons while ignoring the needs of others. The solution is true devotion to God. People who love God worship him for the sake of honoring rather than manipulating Him. And, if we love God, we will also love our neighbors. So, during this Season of Lent, let us consider what God would have us do and not do as we honor Him.

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holylent Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin

his ministry. Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent was a time to prepare new converts for baptism. Today, believers focus on their relationship with God, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of themselves for others. Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter"

"Insanity is defined as doing the same thing over, and over again, expecting different results." This quote is commonly used in 12 Step programs. Yet, it can be a good beginning for us to examine ourselves. Our Lord and our Savior is calling for us to be transformed into His likeness. Therefore, we need to make better choices. And, if we listen closely, certainly we can hear God's call for us to change.

Perhaps a loved one, friend, family member, or co-worker has told you something about yourself that

gets in the way of you being a better person. Maybe you haven't taken your relationship with God very seriously. You go to church on Sunday, and do your share, but you don't really take time to study God's Word. Perhaps you've allowed your mind to become cluttered with ungodly thoughts. You may not be hearing the cry of the needy or can't remember when you've



answered that cry. It could be the deep wounds of resentment and anger from your past that has

plagued your ability to deepen your relationship with God and neighbors. Whatever the case may be, please put yourself in position to receive God's richest blessings.

Something all of us can do is commit ourselves to being more reflective. In doing so, we can examine the desires of our heart and ask God for the strength to abandon the ones that are not of Him and the strength to act upon the ones that are. Prayer and studying God's Word is a great place to start. We may want to get up a half an hour earlier to give God the first fruits of the day. We may want to practice generosity. Giving has always been an important part of Lent. Generosity is an attitude. It is a sense that no matter how much we have, all that we have is a gift from God, and given to us to be shared. Whatever we decide to do or not do, let us not omit fasting. Fasting gives us a greater sense of purpose and awareness of God's grace.

The Season of Lent is also a great time to build-in some family practices, which can be a fun way for us to journey together in our effort to develop a deeper commitment to God through spiritual disciplines.

Let us pray:

Lord, grant us your grace and mercy to become more like you during this Season of Lent, in Jesus' name. Amen.



Unfortunately, there are more in need than space available. They also have an area where those in need can get a shower. If you have sample sizes, hotel sizes or travel sizes, these are ideal for the "baggies" since they have little storage. Many are on the streets or in the woods. If you have any extra blankets or comforters, place them in a plastic bag and put them in the large black box in the Social Hall. Many sleep in their cars or live "in the woods" to quote the house manager of Meeting Ground. We will not be meeting to fill the zip-lock bags, so if you can fill one and donate, that would be a tremendous help. Please do not include anything containing alcohol ie: mouthwash, hand sanitizer.




